### **About the Competition**

The Japan Wizards Statewide Academic Team Competition is a challenging, fun-filled academic team competition for Hawaii's high school students.

In the Japan Wizards Competition, students are asked about topics that include Japanese history, culture, arts, literature, daily life, and language.

The JWC encourages high school students to:

1. Learn about Japan;
2. Gain lifelong learning skills in research, teamwork, and responsibility; and
3. Experience Japan and apply classroom knowledge to real-world experiences.

An educational visit to Japan is awarded to the winning teams.

4. Ensuring that your family members and friends do not visit you in the Activity Center or any Competition breakout rooms for the duration of the Competition.
5. Wearing appropriate length pants (females may also wear appropriate length skirts) and covered shoes. Slippers, sandals, and shorts are not allowed.
